



32nd Sunday of the Year (B) 11th November 2018

The Lord upholds the widow and orphan

Our readings this week encourage us to live our lives not just for ourselves but for others, as Jesus did.




The **First Reading** tells us of a poor destitute widow who shows great generosity as she sacrifices her last scrap of bread for the prophet Elijah.

The **psalmist** urges us to call on our innermost self – on ‘[our] soul’ – to give praise to the God who has great concern for the poor, including widows and orphans (**Psalms**).

In the **Gospel** too, it is the widow who wins the praise of Jesus as he observes her give everything she possesses to the treasury in the Temple. He contrasts her generosity to that of others and holds her up as a role model to the disciples.

The author of the letter to the Hebrews explains how Jesus Christ is the compassionate high priest who offers the gift of his own life for the salvation of mankind (**Second Reading**).

This week, let us pray for the grace to be the Lord’s instruments on earth, showing our care through loving action for the outcasts and marginalised of today.





SYNOD 2020: Thank you to everyone who helped at the Synod Open meeting last week. So many people went away impressed with our Church, but more importantly impressed with our parishioners!

Finding Our Parish and Pastoral Area Synod Members Our parish is asked to provide a member of the Synod. Our Pastoral Area will choose another 8 members some of whom might be from our parish. They will vote on the specific proposals which are presented at the Synod after listening and reflecting over the coming two years. Members of the Synod will commit to attending training sessions and other meetings in addition to attending meetings in their parish and in the Pastoral Area. They should be regular Mass attenders and have an involvement in the life of their parish. It is the job of the parish priest to nominate our parish Synod members and to propose additional names for the 8 Pastoral Area Members. Our Pastoral Area members will include people who work in education or with the sick, those with an interest in social action, young people aged 18-25, parents, those from a minority group etc, to ensure that these groups are given a voice at the Synod. I would very much like your help to find people who are willing to take up this role.

On the Synod notice board there is a leaflet which gives more details about what being a Synod Member will involve and some of the dates of the meetings they will have to attend. People are very welcome to volunteer themselves or to suggest other names. It's quite a big commitment to two full years of listening and discerning but a very important role. Please take some time to think about this and who you think would be a good Synod Member. Suggested names (on the form in church) should be given in by the end of November. Thank you for your help and prayers as we begin this Synod journey to become the Church that God is calling us to be.
