Bereavement Team and Funeral Ministers

**“Blessed are they who mourn;
they shall be consoled”
Matthew 5:3**

Everyone in the faith community has their part to play in caring for those who are bereaved. Here at Holy Rosary the Parish Priest leads the ministry of consolation supported by lay funeral ministers and the bereavement care team.

Priests, as teachers of faith and ministers of comfort, preside at the funeral rites. Sometimes if no priest is available Deacons or a Lay Funeral Minister may lead the funeral rites in church or at the crematoria. Lay Funeral Ministers have received approved training and have been commissioned by the Archbishop. Lay Funeral Ministers may also preside at the Rite of Committal at the graveside or Crematoria.

The Holy Rosary Bereavement Care Team can offer support if needed. This support can be offered in different ways

- They can visit you at home before the funeral
- Offer prayers/Rosary on the vigil (the night before the funeral) in the home of the bereaved or in the funeral home
- Attend and provide support on the day of the funeral
- Contact you after the funeral to see how things are going for you
- An invitation to the annual Bereavement Mass and Service each November

It seeks, in the spirit of justice and charity, to help those who are suffering poverty in whatever form. The SVP meets every fortnight and carries out often unseen work of caring for families and individuals in acute need

We welcome all parishioners to either join or feel free to offer their services whenever they wish. We visit the housebound or those in Care/Nursing Homes who have no or very few other visitors. We provide transport to Church, clinic appointments, hospital appointments, etc. for those who would not otherwise be able to attend independently.

Sacristans



Welcome to the Sacristan Ministry! We hope you find this to be a very rewarding and meaningful ministry and enjoy making our liturgies go as smoothly as possible for our fellow parishioners. Below is a list of frequently asked questions regarding the sacristan ministry. We hope that you will prayerfully consider joining our ministry!

What does a sacristan do?

As Sacristan, we have three main roles: **Security** (of the sacristy and church), **Mass Set-Up** and **Clean-Up**

Mass set up and clean up: At every Mass, you are responsible for setting up for both Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist which means preparing all the books, vessels, offertory, and incense when appropriate.

Which Mass am I assigned to? You can either help on a weekday at one of the Masses or at one of the Sunday masses perhaps every two to three weeks.

What is the time commitment? On a weekday it means coming to church fifteen minutes before Mass begins and on a Sunday about twenty minutes before Mass. A sacristan locks the sacristy after Mass.

How can I become a sacristan? Please speak to one of the sacristans or Fr Philip.
