Trinity Sunday 15th June 2025

The theme for this year's Day for Life (this weekend,) is "Hope does not disappoint: Finding meaning in suffering." Archbishop John says: "What we want to offer as Catholics, is that Jesus Christ is with us in the midst of our suffering. I know that the non-believer will find that difficult, but perhaps it's the implication that Christ is with

us and the way that Christians support one another in suffering, following the model of Jesus and the Good Samaritan, that can help us to be that presence of Christ to others in the midst of suffering."

"People are at the core of Day for Life because Christ's example inspires us to support our loved ones. Human compassion, human presence to another person is at the heart of this theme that hope does not disappoint." Pope Leo XIV has said: "through your common witness to the God-given dignity of every person, without exception, and to the tender Christ-like accompaniment of the seriously ill, all in society will be encouraged to defend rather than undermine a civilisation founded on authentic love and genuine compassion. In this Jubilee Year focussed on the theological virtue of hope, it is **fitting** that your theme, 'Hope does not disappoint — finding meaning in suffering', seeks to draw people's attention to how the mystery of suffering, so prevalent in the human condition, can be transformed by grace into an experience of the Lord's presence, for God is always close to those who are suffering and guides us to appreciate the deeper meaning of life, in love and closeness

Monday 16th: We arrive in Assisi at around 3.30pm and have our first Mas in the pilgrimage centre where we are staying. This will be followed by a night on the town! The first experience of Assisi is always wonderful.

Tuesday 17th: We will visit the great Basilica of St Francis - but just years after his death and decorated with the world heritage frescos by Giotto. Our Mass will be offered for all who have died. The afternoon will be spent exploring the town of Assisi ending at the Basilica of St Clare.

Wednesday 18th: In the morning we will journey up the hill at the back of Assisi to the place where St Francis used to retreat to when he wanted times of quiet. In the afternoon we will have Mass in the chapel of St Damiano - the original chapel that Francis rebuilt and where St Clare lived and died.

Thursday 19th: We will celebrate Mass in the shrine of Blessed Carlo Acutis - the young teenager who has a great love of the Eucharist and the rosary. The afternoon is free with a walk to the Portiuncula inside the Basilica of St Mary of the Angels - the original chapel given to Francis, where the early Franciscan Brothers lived and met.

Friday 20th: We will have our final Mass in Assisi and then make our way to Rome to the airport for our journey home.
