Today's rexhortation our own hospitality. The First humility in

22nd Sunday of the Year: 31st August 2025

Today's readings are a mixture of exhortations to be gentle and humble in our own lives, and to give practical hospitality to the poor.

The **First Reading** gives advice on humility in our behaviour and warns against pride. A wise man or woman is attentive to God and gentle in all aspects of our dealings with others.

The **Psalm** is a song of praise to the God who, in turn, is attentive to the orphan and widow, the poor and the lonely. The

psalmist rejoices in the generous God who gives us new life.

The **Second Reading**, from Hebrews, is full of awe at the revelation of God's power. We have been given Jesus as our mediator, and our home is the heavenly Jerusalem.

Jesus's teaching in the **Gospel** is in the setting of a meal. His parable touches into our feelings of pride or shame and instructs us to be humble. Invitations to his banquet show a definite preference for the poor and lowly.

This week may we follow Jesus, who is 'gentle and humble of heart', in all that we say and do.

Pope Leo said this to altar servers last week: I think it is helpful for all:

From the first day of her existence, and then for centuries, the Church has celebrated Mass, from Sunday to Sunday, in memory of what the Lord did for her. In the hands of the priest and at his words: 'This is my Body, this is my Blood,' Jesus still gives his life on the altar. He still sheds his blood for us today. The celebration of the Mass saves us today! It saves the world today! It is the most important event in the life of the Christian and in the life of the Church, because it is the meeting where God gives himself to us out of love, again and again. The Christian does not go to Mass out of duty, but because they need it – absolutely – we need the life of God who gives himself without awaiting return!"
