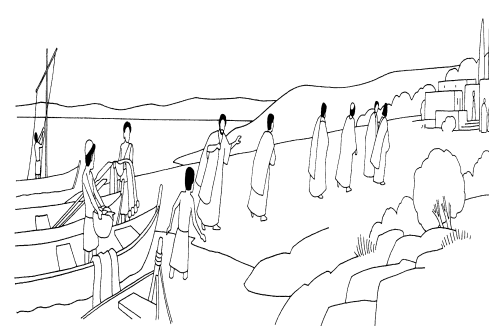

## 3rd Sunday of the Year

### 25th January 2026

Today's readings on this Sunday of the Word of God proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, the light of the world: a beacon drawing all peoples to himself.

When the old tribes of Zebulun and Naphtali were being deported to Assyria, Isaiah promised that their land, then deeply overshadowed by turmoil and war, would one day witness a great light in their midst (1st R). In the Gospel, St Matthew sees the fulfilment of this prophecy. Jesus was, and is, that light. At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus settles in Galilee. After proclaiming the kingdom of heaven, it is striking that his first action is to call his first disciples. The task of witnessing to the kingdom is not something to be done by Jesus alone. Rather he calls followers to share in and continue this work.

If we are to walk in the light of Jesus, Paul warns against tribalism, differences and division. Jesus alone is our light, not any of his followers. Paul's own role is to be a preacher to the humble and to proclaim the counter-cultural message of the cross (2nd R).

This week, we may like to ask the Lord for that light and help in our own lives, and in the lives of all humanity. We pray that we might find ways of sharing his light and compassion with all whom we meet in our suffering and sometimes dark world.

**The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** takes place each year from 18 to 25 January. This ecumenical celebration provides an opportunity to focus our prayers on Christian unity and to know that we are joining with international siblings in Christ. This year the week takes Ephesians 4 v 1-13 as its central text which includes the words "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling." (Eph 4:4).

**World Leprosy Day: Sunday 25th January** marks World Leprosy Day, which aims to raise awareness of a disease that many people think no longer exists. Each year 200,000 people are diagnosed with leprosy and there are millions more who are living with the damaging consequences of delayed leprosy treatment because of the stigma that still surrounds the disease. St Francis Leprosy Guild (SFLG) - which is the UK's only Catholic leprosy charity - has been caring for people with leprosy for 130 years. Through shared values and faith, we encourage our community to support SFLG's vital work and keep people with leprosy in your prayers.

**Holocaust Memorial Day** is an opportunity each year for people around the United Kingdom to stand together with those in their local community, learn about those affected by genocide around the world and take action for the future. In recent years, the number of hate crime offences recorded by the police in the UK has been increasing. Christians have a crucial role to play in changing the unacceptable language and behaviours that stir up racist attitudes and promote hatred. Such change is brought about through actions - if certain groups are being excluded, set out to change that by inviting them to a parish event. If a group is viewed with suspicion or fear, find out more about their way of life and begin a dialogue.
